

Elsa's Prayer Quilt Supply List

43x57" Lap size



This lap-sized quilt, perfect for a prayer quilt, was inspired by the intricate door in the animated Disney movie "Frozen." Choose scraps from two distinct colors - for the sample, a variety of grape-y purples (main color) and royal blues (accent color) were used. Add a high contrast, solid-reading background fabric.

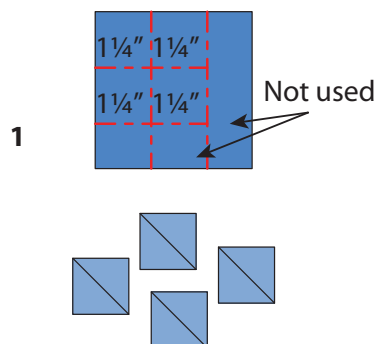
As you make the center star motifs, you'll generate some scraps. Don't worry about waste, those scraps get repurposed in the pieced border.

Please select fabrics, cut and prepare them as noted in the charts. Bring standard sewing supplies to the workshop including sewing machine, cords and foot pedal, 1/4" foot, thread, pins, snips or scissors, acrylic ruler (6 1/2 x 12 1/2", 6 1/2" (or slightly larger) square or similar sizes recommended), rotary cutter, cutting mat, marking tools, trimming tools.

Scraps Needed for the Prayer Quilt

All ScrapTherapy patterns begin with a selection of scraps from an 'inventory' of scraps that have been cut into 2", 3 1/2", and 5" squares.

Square Size	Description	Quantity Needed	Notes and Cutting Instructions
2"	Accent color scrap squares	6	• Trim each square to 1 1/2" for block centers.
3 1/2"	Main color scrap squares	96	
3 1/2"	Accent color scrap squares	24	• Following diagram 1, cut each scrap square into four 1 1/4" squares. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the back of each. Keep matched squares together.

Fabrics and Other Materials for the Prayer Quilt

Materials	Quantity Needed	Notes and Cutting Instructions
Pattern		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ScrapTherapy, The Versatile Nine Patch, from The Taunton Press
Background solid or print	2¾ yards	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Cut seven 3½" width-of-fabric strips; subcut into seventy-two 3½" squares. Following diagram 2, on the back of 48 squares, draw two diagonal lines, one from corner to corner and the other parallel to the first and ½" away. Cut three 2" width-of-fabric strips; subcut into twelve 2x10" strips. Following diagram 3, on the right side of each strip, draw a line in the center along the length of the strip. Cut five 2" width-of-fabric strips; subcut into ninety-six 2" squares. Following diagram 4, on the back of half of the squares, draw a diagonal line from corner to corner. Cut four 1½" width-of-fabric strips; subcut into twenty four 1½x6½" strips for the blocks. Cut three 1½" width-of-fabric strips; subcut into twenty-four 1½x3½" strips for the pieced border. Cut three 2½" width-of-fabric strips; subcut into two 2½x28½" horizontal sashing strips and three 2½x13½" vertical sashing strips. Cut three 2½" width-of-fabric strips, and set aside for the side inner borders. Cut two 2" width-of-fabric strips; subcut into two 2x32½" top and bottom inner borders. Cut six 3" width-of-fabric strips, and set aside for the outer borders.
Binding	½ yard	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Cut six 2¼" width-of-fabric strips for the binding.
Backing	3 yards	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Seam horizontally.
Batting	49 x 63"
