EDUCATION MINUTE

- A. Melanie Brown demonstrated how to put together the April Block of the month, Totally Tulips.
- B. Ten quilting tips for beginners:
 - 1. Select good quality cotton fabric, don't use a blend
 - 2. Purchase a good cutting mat and ruler, the biggest ruler you can get

- 3. Be sure you have new blades in your rotary cutter
- 4. Good needles, burrs happen easily when you run over pins
- 5. Buy fabrics all at the same time for the project
- 6. Workspace--create a space for your mat and rulers at a good height for you
- 7. Accurate ¹/₄" seam
- 8. If you've never sewn before, sign up for a class. Lots of hints and teacher time too.
- 9. Always label your quilt
- 10. Keep a photo album of your quilts

Board Meeting Minutes March 14,2018

Meeting was called to order by President Marcia Harlamert at 6:33pm. Others in attendance were: Vice President Linda Brace, Treasurer Karen Tomczak, Secretary Kim Medlock, Parliamentarian Elaine Fergen, Librarian Cheryl Risley, Marcia Healy, and Jeannie Snodgrass.

<u>Corrections/Additions to February Board Meeting Minutes</u>

Change paragraph referencing request from the Palmer Museum to read: There was an unclear request from the Palmer Museum, that we are "bookending" him in July. Sarah Lorimer made a motion that if the request was to give up one of our scheduled days in July that we say no. Seconded by Karen Tomczak; motion passed.

Linda Brace made a motion to accept the minutes as amended. Cheryl Risley seconded; motion passed.

Treasurer's Report

Karen presented the report. Marcia explained what the report for our monthly newsletter should include. We need a check register report monthly showing what accounts were affected in addition to the general ledger report. These need to be emailed to all Board Members prior to the monthly meeting so we can have our questions ready in advance to shorten this portion of the meeting.

Unfinished Business

a) Depot request for July: he wanted to know if we could leave our quilts hanging for display at their wine tasting event since he is scheduled on Friday between our two dates in July. Last time this was asked, Marcia Harlamert and Ree Moffitt hung and took down quilts on the day. Marcia would call Joan (City of Palmer) and let her know that our quilts will be hung there, and to not let anyone take them down. We need to include Service in this discussion. The quilts would be taken down on Saturday at Open Sew. We could make signs to say quilts were made by VQG. Linda Brace made a motion that we agree to the request to leave the

- quilts hanging from July 11-13, 2019, if the Service Committee is in agreement. Elaine Fergen seconded; motion passed.
- b) Marcia elected to table the Position Descriptions and Committee Policy Updates.
- Treasurer Position description: Kim will email documents to everyone for next month.

New Business

- a) April Board Meeting will be changed to April 22, 2019, at 6:30pm. Marcia will check to see if the room is available.
- b) Request from Treasurer to purchase Microsoft Suite: the yearly subscription price of \$99.99 includes Word, Excel, PowerPoint, Outlook, Publisher, and Access, with up to six users which would allow a place for all Board Members to file documents pertaining to the Guild. Elaine Fergen made a motion to purchase a computer for the Secretary and purchase Microsoft Office 365 home for \$99.99 per year out of the Technology Purchases Budget. Cheryl Risley seconded; motion passed. Marcia appointed Kim Medlock and Karen Tomczak to shop for the computer and bring back information for Board to decide.
- c) Request from Nancy Durand: the Alaska State Fair contacted her to see if someone is willing to make a t -shirt quilt for the fair. It was decided to bring this request to the membership.
- d) Request from Sarah Lorimer to approve an article for the Annual Who Let the Girls Out event. Elaine moved that we approve the article. Linda Brace seconded; motion passed.

"Who Let the Girls Out" Small Quilt Silent Auction features items made by members of the Valley Quilters Guild. Our members were challenged to make items with the theme "Who Let the Girls Out" and will include items such as quilted table runners, wall hangings, purses, mini quilts, and much more. The Silent Auction starts Friday, April 26, and ends at 4:00pm Saturday, April 27, 2019, at the Palmer Depot. The public is welcome, and there is no fee to attend the Silent Auction. All winning bids will need to be picked up by 5:00pm on April 27, at the Palmer Depot, or the items will be shipped to the winning bidder at the expense of the winner.



Board Meeting Minutes continued

The Valley Quilters Guild, Inc. is a non-profit organization and was formed in 1985 to promote quilting in the Matanuska Valley. Our main objectives are service to our community and the education of quilters. We serve the community by donating quilts to organizations and groups who approach us with their needs. All funds raised at our Small Quilt Silent Auction will be used to support the activities of the Guild. Want to become a member or donate? - e) Alaska Farmland Trust has asked the Guild to make a fundraiser quilt using the patterns from Farm Girl Vintage by Lori Holt. This would be considered part of Special Events, so the committee can decide. The discussion indicated that we are all in favor, and this is part of why our Guild exists, to make a difference in our community.
- f) Facebook request from Family Promise to "take on a retirement project" will be passed along to the Service Committee. It was suggested to bring it to the membership to see if someone wants to step up for this request.
- g) Library update: Cheryl Risley reported that labels are being printed now for the new books. Her goal is to have the Library open for the April Guild meeting, but not for Open Sew since she won't be there.

Mail/Suggestion Box

- a) Kits for fair should not be cut in private homes. How can others help? RESPONSE: we had a cutting party at Open Sew in March with three people participating.
- b) Where are the bags someone bought for fair? Why did some get them and others did not? RESPONSE: they are stored in the storage building for use at next year's fair. There are approximately 200 left. Those who make a large purchase at the fair booth are given a bag.
- c) Posting photos only on social media sites prevents those who do not "do" those sites from seeing guild photos. Please continue to post on website. RE-

- SPONSE: we will check into the cost of having a gallery on our website.
- d) Read thank you notes from people who received quilts. RESPONSE: we will read them at meetings in the future.
- e) Special Mystery Group that Education is sponsoring. RESPONSE: not everyone is on Facebook to see the photos there. They are only displayed in the area designated for Education.
- f) Demo tables were awesome. Thank You! RE-SPONSE: Thank you, we all had fun doing it!

Education: Jeannie talked about Beret Nelson, a teacher from Fairbanks, coming on Saturday, May 18, 2019. She would like to make an exception to the 30-day cancellation policy in this instance because of some family issues Beret has. Linda made a motion to allow Jeannie to change the 30-day cancellation period to 15 days for this one-time contract with Beret Nelson. Cheryl Risley seconded; motion passed.

Kits will be available and donations can be accepted at the guild meeting on Thursday, April 4. Hope to see you there!

Fair Booth Committee

Education Presents:

Bucket List: Note cards with your UFOs are all due in March. If you haven't turned yours in, you can photograph it and send a picture of your card to Education by the end of March. For each completed UFO, you are eligible for each month's quilt shop \$15 gift certificate drawing.

Fabric Challenge: April is the last month to join the 3-month Fabric Challenge (February-May). The \$5 charge will be returned in May if your quilt of any size is complete. You must use the Fabric Challenge FQ on the front of your quilt and may not use more than the one FQ. Complete rules are on the website under Education.

CLASSES:

Ree Moffitt's "One Block Wonder" is Saturday, April 6, at the Grandview Hotel in Wasilla, 10-4. Class limit is now 16, with just a few spots open. Cost: \$20. Sign up on the website or at the April meeting.

Beret Nelson's Wallhanging Class: Saturday, May 18. Sign up begins at the April Guild meeting. Cost: \$40 for this Fairbanks teacher, plus the cost of your choice of pattern, which includes all the fabric. One sample is shown here. Supplies for the class would include all the basic sewing supplies, sewing machine, and a variety of threads for decorative stitching. More info will be on the website soon.



Melanie Brown's "Flowers in My Cabin" class will be in late September. Signup begins in April. Cost will be \$20 for guild members.

Mystery Blocks Comment: A comment was made to Education about mystery blocks often being hung around the depot during guild meetings. The blocks from this guild event are displayed, usually in the Education area only, for three months during the period of time that the mystery runs, 15 weeks. This gives participants and guild members the chance to see the variety of patterns, designed by Eleri Taylor and meant for beginners and more experienced quilters, as well as choices of fabrics and colors that are used to create the blocks. Though this group has a Facebook site, not all members choose to join, either for work or personal reasons. This is a way for all involved to share their work with others, just as we all enjoy seeing the service quilts that many have participated in making. There have been many positive comments about the variety of layouts that different participants have created in their finished mystery quilts.

We will also have small squares of star fabric available for those who need it for their July BOM "Star Flag" BOM.
