

<u>Fabric:</u> Purples & Yellow – Light (L) Medium (M) Dark (D) * Piecing: One center Square + half-square triangles

Option: You can use the quick method for HSTs





5B - Flying Geese

Fabric: Spring Prints in Lt (L), Dark Lt (DL), Med (M), & Dark Med (DM)





Piecing: Sew small triangles to large triangles, press toward sm triangles, trim triangle points. Plain=L, Stripes=DL, Lt checks=M, Dk checks=DM






CAMP NOTES:
