#### **New Members and Visitors**

Visitors were welcomed to the meeting including Jim Cooper, former co-owner of Just Sew and Alisa Nunn. Cathy Torrence and Karla Rathburn were welcomed as members.

#### **New Officers**

Marcia Harlamert introduced and swore in the new Treasurer and Secretary as recommended by the Board. Heather Wagner will fulfill the role of Secretary through the end of the previous term and Michelle Buehner will fulfill the role of Treasurer through the end of the previous term.

#### Member Update

Marcia Harlamert updated the membership on several members or their family members who had injuries or illnesses. The members or their family members were Peggy Benson, Marcia Healy, Lois Munford, Glenda Cross's husband, Glenda Burke's husband, and Patti Dubler.

#### **Special Program**

Meg Hills presented the three grantees for 2019 on behalf of the Grant Committee. Susan Smith from Takotna, Megan Henry from Airport Heights Elementary in Anchorage and Christa Williams from Cordova received grants for their programs.

Susan Smith from Takotna wanted to do something for the Iditarod. Her program involved students from Kindergarten to 4th grade. They worked with silk hoops and created a quilt depicting the Iditarod using water colors and acrylics.

Megan Henry at Airport Heights Elementary teaches an afterschool arts class for 3rd and 4th graders and 5th and 6th graders. Each group has one week where they explore the use of fabric arts.

Christa Williams from Cordova taught students how to knit and crochet hats for Seattle Children's Hospital as part of her arithmetic program. A video was shared with the membership of her program results.

The 2020 grant opportunities will be announced in August to schools across Alaska. Elaine Fergen was recognized



for her many years of service to the Grants Committee. Meg Hills noted grants are being offered to afterschool programs because of the decrease in applicants from traditional school day programs.

Old Business: Elaine moved and Linda seconded that those items tabled to the July meeting be tabled to the August meeting. Motion passed.


Reports: Marcia reported that Kim Medlock has resigned as Webmaster, and that she has appointed Sarah Lorimer as an interim Webmaster.

### **Education Presents:**

#### Melanie Brown's "Flowers in My Cabin" Class:

Saturday, September 21, 10-5, Location TBA. Signup continues. Cost is \$20 for guild members. The name of a book with a similar idea will be discussed, but Melanie's design is very different than the quilt in that book, so the book is not required. Quilt is displayed at guild meetings. Signup should be available soon on the Guild's website.

#### September 15-Week Mystery Quilt:

We now have 12 for the mystery. Unless we get a minimum of 21, the cost will be \$12 (with 21 or more, it would be \$9). Payment is required by the September guild meeting, the deadline for signup.

The Mystery will begin in mid September, with class information, and "Sneaky Hints" to help you sort and label your precuts, beginning 5 days before. Precuts we will use will be one print jellyroll and one solid jellyroll. The solid can be one color (cream, white, black, grey, etc) or a combination of solids. You also have the option of cutting your own  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " strips of prints and/or solids (42 strips = 1 jellyroll, generally two strips of each fabric). This makes a quilt 66  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 79  $\frac{1}{2}$ ". Blocks are 12  $\frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished. Finishing and layout instructions will be given at the end.

Mystery blocks are emailed weekly for 15 weeks, and you make two blocks of each. Great for beginners and more experienced quilters! Fun and good exercise in color! Completed blocks will be displayed at Education during the Mystery to show the variety. Jeannie will be available at Open Sew or by email to help anyone with their blocks, although Eleri's directions are clear and easy to follow. Those signed up have the option of being included in the group's Quilting With Precuts Facebook site, where you can share your blocks and ask questions.

#### **August Guild Meeting:**

Kathy Buirge will demonstrate the September BOM "Spools".

Enter two different August "Sticks" blocks for a chance to win the following month's BOM fat quarters for each block entered. Participation continues to be great! Darcey Treadway won about 20 of the patriotic "Star Flag" blocks for July. I'm sure she will have that quilt together in no time at all.




# Vallley Quilters Guild Alaska State Fair

## **Contest Rules:**


- All bookmarks shall be made with fabric, thread and embellishments
