and Marcia Healy. The quilt was started by his mother who has passed.



PATCHWORK PIECES



There were 204 quilted items donated by 101 incredible quilters to Friends of Alaska CASA's 22nd Annual Silent Quilt Auction this year. The quilts sold for \$31,535, cards and totes sold for \$896, raffle ticket sales were \$5,975, and cash donations were \$1,693, for a grand total of \$40,099! Once again, we are overwhelmed with gratitude for the generous quilters and the members of our communities that faithfully attend this event every year. The following 33 extraordinary Valley Quilters' Guild members donated 73 quilts, which resulted in \$14,670 of the quilt total – nearly 1/2 of the actual quilt income. More great news – with the increase in the sale of the quilts this year, the average price per quilt was \$155, up from \$101 last year!


