Board Meeting Minutes December 10, 2020

The Board Meeting of the Valley Quilters Guild was called to order at 6:37 p.m. on December 10, 2020 via Zoom due to the on-going COVID pandemic by Guild President, Marcia Harlamert. Guests: Darcey Tredway, President-Elect and Jeannie Snodgrass – Education Committee Chair

Approval of Minutes

Minutes from the November meeting were reviewed. Elaine Fergen submitted an addition to the minutes to add the responsible Board Member to the proposed monthly program listing. The list was amended to include the following:

Elaine Fergen submitted changes to the minutes to amend the language to state Darcey Tredway's

idea to highlight sewing rooms was not to be a program, but to be one or two rooms per meeting. Education policies were tabled to the December Board Meeting. Jeannie Snodgrass was to update the policies and send them as a Word document to the Board prior to the meeting.

Under New Business, Elaine Fergen requested the addition of reminding members of the process. Under Position Vacancies, Elaine Fergen requested to add she would call selected members to try to fill the Secretary and Historian positions.

Elaine Fergen moved to approve the minutes with the additions and corrections. Michelle Buehner seconded the motion and it passed.

Treasurer's Report

Elaine Fergen commented she appreciated having the current and previous month financials available in the reports. Michelle Buehner noted there is more information available in the spreadsheets for the Board to drill into the financials.

Judy Foster noticed there was an approximate loss of \$4800 for the year. Michelle Buehner stated with the Guild's savings and decreases in expected costs (return of Depot rentals, less janitorial services, etc.) there has been a net loss of \$5425.65 for 2020. This does not include any current payments for membership or reimbursements since she has not been able to access the mailbox this month.

Elaine Fergen requested a copy of the ledger be provided with the year-end financials for review. She stated this should be added to all of the monthly reports to be reviewed in the future.

Elaine Fergen reported she had completed a review of the Gaming books and will provide Cindy Montague, the Gaming Committee Chair, with a detailed report of questions and recommended updates.

The Board discussed the new website's ability to create a newsletter and whether the activity should be assigned to the Webmasters. One of the Webmasters has agreed to take responsibility for the activity. The website will automatically mail members when the newsletter is complete and it will pull dates and other information directly from the calendar and other areas of the website.

Michelle Buehner moved to have the newsletter move to the website as of the February newsletter completed at the end of January. Melanie Brown seconded the motion. The Board approved the motion.

Depot Rental for 2021 – Michelle Buehner will pay for the Depot on the first business day

of January for the 2021 anticipated rental dates.

January Meeting – The Board discussed the need to continue to use Zoom in light of the pandemic. Marcia Harlamert agreed to temporarily continue to provide her personal subscription to the Guild until the Board determines another option for meeting virtually.

Elaine Fergen moved to continue holding Guild meeting via Zoom through 2021 as needed. Melanie Brown seconded the motion and the motion was approved.

Judy Foster clarified the intent is to use the Depot is possible, but Zoom will continue to be used and a refund for the Depot will be requested after the Board meetings if the General Membership meetings and/or Open Sew are cancelled for the following month. Michelle Buehner moved to hold Open Sews if the Depot is open. Elaine Fergen seconded the motion and the motion passed.

The agenda for the January meeting was discussed. Installation of Officers will happen before the program and then Darcey Tredway will officially take over the meeting as President.

Unfinished Business Continued

Job Descriptions – The Treasurer’s job description was tabled until January. Marcia Harlamert will send the draft version to the new Board members.

There was a discussion regarding the inconsistency between the Librarian’s job duties and the Board policies. Judy Foster moved the policies be amended to state library books overdue over three months will be listed in the newsletter without the member’s name. The Librarian will contact the borrower. Michelle Buehner seconded the motion and the motion was approved.

Meeting was adjourned at 7:56 p.m. The next Board Meeting will be held at 7:00 p.m. on December 17, 2020 via Zoom for a Special Meeting to review 2020 Board minutes.

2021 Blocks Of The Months & Education Fat Quarter Packets:

Monthly 2021 BOM demos will continue at Guild Zoom meetings. The 2021 BOM Patterns/Links are on the VQG website, “members only” section. If you make 1 or 2 of each month’s BOM, you will be eligible to win Education’s FQ packet with fabrics for the next month’s BOM. Turn in or mail blocks to Jeannie Snodgrass in time for the Zoom guild meeting. If Open Sew returns, turn them in then.

THE BUCKET LIST CONTINUES IN 2021:

Jeannie has the Bucket List file at her house if questions or you need a copy of yours.

For now, Jeannie will keep each member’s 2020 Bucket List cards. If you need to add UFOs to your list, send Jeannie a photo of your new list of described entries. Include your name and the year 2021. You have until March 2021 to add entries, which can include anything that was begun by the end of Dec 2020. Entries are unlimited. Turn cards in at the next Open Sew, or mail or send photos to Jeannie. If you don’t have a notecard(s) to make your list, you can use paper or anything of similar size that will fit into the small-notecard-size container. The January drawing will be for quilts completed in December; send photos and the name of those you complete. Numbering many items is helpful.

MARCH PANEL CHALLENGE: New Deadline: March 2021. Let Jeannie know if you are making a panel quilt(s), and I will add you to the Panel Quilt Challenge signup sheet. We encouraged you to make these for the Fair Booth, but Education decided they can be made for anything you need them to be for. If you choose to make any for the 2021 Fair Booth, a suggested focus is on Alaskana, which is very popular. Each panel quilt completed = eligible for March drawings for 3

September Orphan Block Challenge:

All 20 of the Orphan Block Challenge packets put together by Ree Moffitt have been given out. Thanks to everyone who took these. Some of the orphan block quilt tops have been completed.

Deadline to turn in completed quilts is the October 2021 Annual Meeting. If your quilt is completed sooner, you can turn it into Service, where finished quilts are needed. For each quilt completed for Service, you will be eligible for a Goodie Basket drawing put together by Education Committee members, which will be held at the October 2021 Annual Mtg.

Education Committee Membership: We welcome Linda Kau to our Ed committee. If anyone would like to join our committee, please let Melanie Brown, VQG’s VP know, and she will add you to our signup sheet. We have fun deciding BOMs and FQs for each upcoming year and choosing classes and challenges for the guild. We are a small, friendly committee. New ideas and input are always welcome. For now our meetings are held by Zoom. Jeannie will hold practice sessions for anyone wanting to learn their way around Zoom. It can be downloaded for free.

CLASSES, CHALLENGE, MYSTERY 2021:

Jeannie will present a PowerPoint at the January Zoom guild meeting that will include upcoming 2021 classes, a challenge (think color!), and a spring mystery. All info will also be added to the website in January. For now these are planned to be held by Zoom, though that may change later next year. Mary Thompson has agreed to teach her collage flamingo class by Zoom sometime in 2021. Many of you may have seen her various flamingo designs on Facebook. Watch for the date at the January meeting.

SERVICE COMMITTEE

On behalf of the guild we were able to donate 41 quilts over the last 2 months. We took in 23 quilts in December. Thanks to all who donated because, despite not being able to meet, the community needs still exist.

The organizations to which we donated quilts this year are: AK Center for Resource Families, CASA, Children's Place, Family Promise, Heartreach Center, Hospice, My House, Pioneer Home Palmer, Project Linus, Red Cross and Women's Shelter.

I have checked with both Sylvia and Mary and until we can meet at the depot again, completed quilts and pieced tops can be dropped off at Sylvia's Quilt Depot in Wasilla or Just Sew in Palmer, BUT you must include the date, your name, my name and phone number AND please call me (you can leave a message) so I will know to go get them and the shops won't have to call me or store them for any length of time. They don't have a lot of storage space and don't want to be responsible for the guild service items. Please do not leave door prizes or QOVS for me to collect.

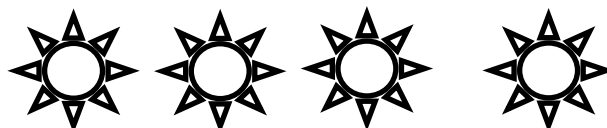

machine, please feel free to do so. You could do straight line quilting, stitch in the ditch, echoing or meandering.

It was definitely an interesting quilt auction this year - our first ever online event. As most of you already know, I limited the number of quilts to 60 and requested quilts from quilters who had donated to the event for 10 or more years. I have been informed that some have questioned why there were quilt donors who had donated less than 10 years. I initially sent out the request for quilts to 63 quilters who met the 10-year criteria. Thirteen the 10-year quilters were unable to donate this year and, therefore, I went back through my list for 9, 8, 7 and 6 year donors until I reached the desired goal of 60 quilts. I hope this clears up any misconception or confusion; please feel free to contact me if you have any questions.

There were 63 quilts donated by 61 incredibly talented and generous quilters to Friends of Alaska CASA's 24th Annual Quilt Auction this year. The quilts sold for \$15,640; raffle ticket sales were \$3,500; and cash donations were \$3,350, for a grand total of \$22,490. Once again, we are overwhelmed with gratitude for the generous quilt donors and for the members of our Alaska communities and beyond that braved the unknown, registered online, and bid on the quilts. The following 25 extraordinary Valley Quilters' Guild members donated a quilt this year, which resulted in \$5,590 of the quilt income total:

We'll be back again next year for our 25th Annual Silent Quilt Auction on November 27, 2021, either in person or online. If online, I promise we will do better with the quilt photo quality!

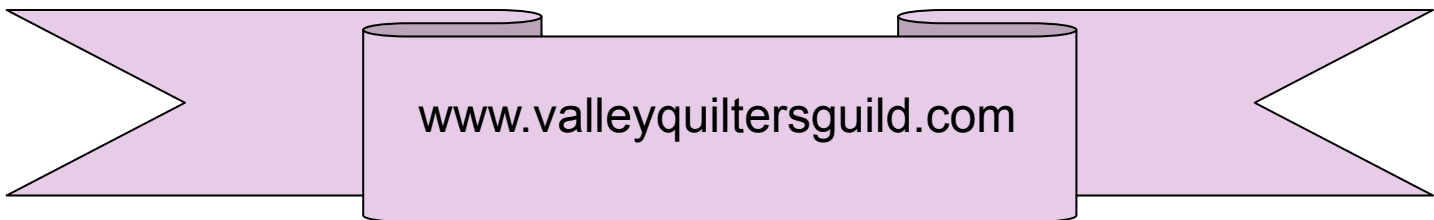
