Crazy Quilts :: Gloria Snodgrass, with help from Cindy Medbery

This style started during the Victorian era when needlework was acceptable for women to do. You start with a foundation, then embellish with embroidery, buttons, beads, etc. She learned to add beads and buttons after all the stitching is done so that the thread doesn't get caught up. Lots of

books are published for embroidery stitches. Crazy quilts are very versatile, and can be made into whatever you want: vest, tablerunner, stocking, wallhanging. Dates were included: births, deaths, anniversary, etc. Put a spider web on every one for luck. The show and tell was amazing. Gloria and Cindy will be teaching a class in November, watch for more information.




