MEMBERSHIP MEETING MINUTES May 2, 2019

Marcia introduced our guest, Sherry Fetzmer. There were no new members.

Since it was our Annual May Tea Party we broke for a half hour to enjoy refreshments and visiting. Many ladies were wearing their fashion hats.

Program: Building A Quilt

Marcia Harlamert had made packets of 5 basic shapes you would find in making a quilt. Each table was given a packet with instructions to make a whole quilt. She also did a mini-reminder of triangles and how to use them. We were given about 20 minutes to see how each table could come up with a quilt from their pieces. Marcia then showed some ideas that were in the "Fons & Porter – Love of Quilting" Jan/Feb 2006 issue.

Education Minute/Class Announcement:

May 18 will be the Beret Nelson class from 10-5:00 and will be held at the Grandview Hotel. There are 5 kits available for the class. Kits include everything (fabric, batting, backing) but you will need to bring the color thread to fit your kit. Projects can be finished in class. Cost is \$40. for the class and you will need to purchase a kit for \$35. from the instructor, Beret Nelson. There will be a Free Trunk Show at noon and you are all invited to this.

The Fabric Challenge entries are hung and you need to vote at the break on the one you like best. If you did a Challenge Quilt please be sure to get your \$5. entry fee back from the Education Table. There will be 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place prizes.

Sue Peterson demonstrated the June BOM. It is 3 easy pieces and Marcia has challenged us all to fill the whole front wall with blocks for June.

Sue also did the Education Minute – Organize Your Stash - It is recommended to use a Shoe Bag. Roll up your fabric by color and put them in the pockets, put Jelly Rolls in pockets of shoe bag, etc. Also get a Crib Railing and hang your fabrics over the rails when trying to decide on colors to use in a project. Creative ways to get you organized.

AT&T is increasing their fee by \$5 per month for the iPad which is used at meetings to accept payments.

Elaine Fergen moved that we authorize Karen Tomczak to use the debit card she has obtained for the VQG Checking account to pay for our AT&T and Bluehost accounts. Cheryl Risley seconded; motion passed.

Meeting adjourned at 9:32pm.



Education Presents:

Bucket List: For each completed UFO, you are eligible for each month's quilt shop \$15 gift certificate drawing. Fabric Challenge: There were lots of great entries for the Fabric Challenge! Prizes, accompanied by the Fabric Challenge FQ, were 1st place Gift Certificate to Susan Franznick for her bird and butterlies, 2nd place 1989 VQG cookbook to Ruth Sielaff for her vase with flowers, and 3rd place to Sharon Hillstrom for her flying geese table runner/wall hanging – all beautiful!

BOMs: For the June meeting, Ruth Sielaff will demonstrate July's Block of the Month "Flag Star" and do an Education Minute. We will also have small squares of star fabric available for those who need it. Remember to continue making each month's BOM and be eligible for a drawing of FQs for the following month's BOM for each of 1-2 blocks you make.

FQ Drawing: Reminder that you can enter up to 3 FQs that are designated each month. They should all be 100% cotton and each one be a different fabric.

Melanie Brown's "Flowers in My Cabin" Class: September 21. Signup continues. Cost is \$20 for guild members. A book will be required, but they are older books and very inexpensive.

Potential September 15-Week Mystery Quilt: Signup at the June meeting if interested in another emailed Eleri Taylor 15-week precut mystery class in September. Blocks are emailed weekly for 15 weeks, and you make two of each. Great for beginners and more experienced quilters. Fun and good exercise in color. If enough interest (21 to keep our price low), precuts needed will be announced. Jeannie will have a couple of mystery quilts she's completed to show as examples. Her Fabric Challenge quilt was a mystery using precuts of a print jellyroll (batiks) and a solid jellyroll (ombre'). Cost: \$9, slightly higher than the previous \$7.50 to cover the Guild's VAT charge from Etsy.

Marcia Harmening Classes – Marcia of Happy Stash Quilts will be here in November 2018. Hopefully, we will soon have class options for members to help us decide which of Marcia's classes will be held. Marcia is an Outside teacher, and her classes will cost \$40. Check out her classes/patterns on her Happy Stash Quilts website. "Baubles" is one class we had considered previously.


