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Membership Meeting Minutes February 6, 2020

Opening

The regular meeting of the Valley Quilters Guild was called to order at 7:01 p.m. on February 06, 2020 at the Palmer Depot by Guild President, Marcia Harlamert.

Special Program

Debby Hudson provided a presentation called Packing for Your Last Trip. She shared important facts she had learned over the past year in assisting her family after the loss of her sister. Key points were:

- When choosing an Executor of a will, make sure the person is willing and able to take on the responsibilities and then communicate it to all family members.
- Make sure you understand the probate process in the State you are residing as well as ensure your will is available in the same location you are residing.
- If there are items you want specific family members to have upon your passing or there are things you wish to have kept in the family, make sure you have made a list of these items in advance.
- Organize your quilting supplies and other items so it will be easier for your family to abide by your wishes.
- Make sure your family knows if there are items you wish to be donated to specific organizations.

Members shared their experiences as well as other ideas for preparing quilting and crafting items.

Board Meeting Minutes February 13, 2020

Opening

The Board Meeting of the Valley Quilters Guild was called to order at 6:40 p.m. on February 13, 2020 at the Mat-Su Borough Animal Shelter by Guild President, Marcia Harlamert. Attendees: Marcia Harlamert – President, Heather Wagner – Secretary, Michelle Buehner – Treasurer, Melanie Brown – Vice-President, Judy Foster – Librarian, and Sarah Lorimer, Historian.

Approval of Minutes

Minutes from the January Board Meeting were reviewed and approved with no changes or additions.

Treasurer's Report

The Board reviewed the Treasurer's report. There was discussion held on the carry-over from 2019 for Amazon Smile proceeds. Michelle Buehner will check the balance and move it to the 2020 report.

A list of participants was received for Retreat participants. The list did not match the paid participants in the Guild's accounting software. The differences were corrected.

The Board discussed concerns with the inconsistency of management of financial records between the committees that receive donations and/or payments for services. It was suggested that guideline be created for each committee to address this issue and the Standing Policies be updated.

Committee Reports

Fair Booth – Sarah Lorimer reported for the Fair Committee. The committee has cut kits with Alaska themes for sale at the 2020 Alaska State Fair. There will be an increase in cost on some of the items that have sold better in past fairs.

The Board discussed concerns with Guild property be-

ing at a member or Committee Chairs personal residence if they would be out of town for an extended period of time. It was suggested every committee be provided with an emergency contact form to provide the Guild with a member who can access the Guild's property in the event of an emergency. A full inventory list should be provided to the Guild with this contact information should the Guild's property need to be retrieved.

Grant Committee – The Grant Committee will be reviewing and revising the current grant package in March to prepare it for distribution to the schools.

Education Committee – Melanie Brown reported the Education Committee is preparing their presentation on Panels for the March General Membership Meeting. Alaskan panel quilts will be highlighted to encourage them to be sewn for the Fair booth. There will be a drawing in June or July for everyone who has completed and donated a quilt to the Fair booth with this theme. They are also partnering with the Fair Committee to create kits for the Sew for Fair.

Unfinished Business

Board Retreat – The Board Retreat will be held on Saturday, February 15, 2020 from 10:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m.

April Meeting – The Board discussed what topics would be of interest to the members and what they would demonstrate for the April Round Robin special program.

Historian Presentation – The annual presentation by the Historian will be held at the August General Membership Meeting. Sarah Lorimer will create a slide show for the members.

Webmaster – Two members are now available to assist with the website. The site went down recently because of a missed payment of the hosting service. The payment has been made through January 2021. Sarah Lorimer reported the company that is currently assisting with the website does not want to continue to support the Guild's site. The Board will need to look for other options. The current page is automati-

cally pulling from the social media sites. This is the reason the pictures are updating from current meetings. However, other content is not updated and should be updated soon.

Meeting Content – Sarah Lorimer reported there had been several

comments regarding the content of the February General Membership Meeting and its applicability to a quilting topic. There was a request to keep the topics more quilting related in the future. The Board made note of the request and will consider this when choosing topics for 2021.

Thank You Notes to Guild – The Board discussed the most efficient way to make sure members are aware of thank you notes received for donations. It was decided to display them in the lobby on the bulletin board for members.

Request to Mail Newsletter – A member requested that she be mailed a copy of the newsletter instead of receiving it by e-mail. The Board discussed the timeliness of providing the information as well as the additional responsibility added to the Newsletter Chair. It was decided members who wished to have a printed copy and could not print one for themselves should be requested to find a friend in the Guild who could print a copy for them.

Adjournment

Judy Foster moved to adjourn the meeting and Heather Wagner seconded the motion.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:45 p.m. The next Board Meeting will be held at 6:30 p.m. on March 12, 2020, at the Mat-Su Borough Animal Shelter.

Fabric: Green Prints

L (Light), M (medium), DM (dark med)

Sorry, not very clear. E=5-3/8, F=5-3/4, G=3-1/8, H=3-1/2, I=5/8

Center squares are H & I. Circles are from my first quilt.

<u>Piecing</u>: Just build from center out. Piece center squares I,

add small triangles H, then larger triangles F, then largest triangles E. **TIPS**: Fold triangles in half to center before adding each time. Careful of bias.


I go through each fabric color and cut all of those at one time (i.e., all Lights).

<u>Fabric:</u> Purples & Yellow – Light (L) Medium (M) Dark (D) * <u>Piecing:</u> One center Square + half-square triangles

Option: You can use the quick method for HSTs



For those of you making your own quilt, you will choose 2 of the 3 versions of the monthly BOM. The April BOM is Mosaic #6 Block A, but those making quilts would make two in your colors and for you to keep
