B. Quilting Tips for Members -T-N-TThread - On your sewing machine if you are having trouble with the thread, take it out and completely re-thread your machine. This will usually fix the problem.

Needle – Check to make sure the needle has no barbs. Change your needle often.

Tension – Kind of check the bobbin thread to make sure it is feeding easily. Might have to adjust the bobbin tension.

Jeannie Snodgrass announced the One Block Wonder class still has 3 spots left. It will be held at the Grandview Hotel on Saturday from 10-5:00. \$20 for members. See web site for details.
