Membership Meeting Minutes

October 3, 2019

Opening

The regular meeting of the Valley Quilters Guild was called to order at 6:30 p.m. on October 03, 2019 at the Palmer Depot by Guild President, Marcia Harlamert. Eleven members who sponsored the tables were thanked. The membership started the meeting with the annual potluck.

Meeting resumed at 7:00 p.m. Marcia Harlamert recognized Board Members, Committee Chairs, Committee Members and volunteers who made the Guild activities and events a success over the past year.

New Members and Visitors

Visitors were welcomed to the meeting including Adelle Johnston, Arlene Boaman, Debbie Kenny, Sherry Fetzner, and Ruth Zessin.

Member Update

Members with October birthdays were recognized by the membership.

Corrections or Additions to Minutes

There were no additions or corrections to the minutes.

Policy on Memorial Gifts

If a member passes away, the Guild currently gives \$50 in their memory to the non-profit of their choice. Cheryl Risley motioned to change the policy to give a quilt with the member's name on a label in their honor to one of the Guild's non-profit partners. Kathy Buirge seconded the motion. Discussion was held. The motion was defeated.



Nancy Moore motioned life members could choose to donate the equivalent of their membership dues to a memorial fund. These funds would be used for memorial gifts to the non-profit of the members' choice. If no funds are available in the account, a quilt will be donated in the members' name to a Guild non-profit partner. Ree Moffit seconded the motion. A friendly amendment was added to the motion by Neena Levan to indicate the label on the quilt will have the first name and last initial only. Nancy Moore seconded the amendment. The motion passed.

Board Election

Parliamentarian Elaine Fergen announced the Slate of Candidates.

No nominations were added from the floor. Elections were held during the break. The polls closed at 7:26 p.m.

Committee and Other Announcements

- Fred Meyers, Amazon Smile, and other Funds – Marcia Harlamert reminded the membership the Guild receives funds from Fred Meyer, Amazon Smile and Craftsy/Blue Print. These funds are used for the Guild’s technology. They have purchased dies for the Accuquilt Go, the Treasurer’s laptop, audio visual equipment and they will purchase a computer for the Secretary position. Instructions to sign up are available on the website.
- 2020 Committee Sign-up – Marcia Harlamert gave the membership an overview of the eleven committees available for volunteers. She reminded the membership the committees meet in December to choose a Committee Chair. A Board Member will be assigned to each committee as a liaison to



the Board.

- General Announcements – The Board found Valley Quilter’s Guild pins and had previously voted to have them given to new members instead of visitors. New members since May 2018 should see Michelle Buehner to receive their pins. Members who would like a pin are able to purchase one from Michelle Buehner as well. Members were asked to please print their names on the sign-in sheet. There will be a social media opt out form available at the registration table for those members who do not wish their pictures to be on social media. Members who wish to make a general announcement at the Guild meetings should e-mail Marcia Harlamert five days in advance of the meeting to be added to the agenda. General announcements will be included as time is available. Members were reminded about Open Sew and not to bring children or pets to open sew.
- Education Committee – Jeannie Snodgrass demonstrated the November Block of the Month, “Swirling Leaves.” She and Melanie Brown also showed examples of

blocks the members could print with stamps available in the Library. The Roll and Go Stadium Quilt class is set for November 9th from 10 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. The Education Committee will be planning the 2020 Blocks of the Month and Education. They will be sharing this at the November meeting.



- Treasurer – Michelle Buehner moved to accept the budget as presented to the membership. Kim Barr seconded the motion. There was no discussion. The budget was approved.
- Parliamentarian – Elaine Fergen provided the results of the election. Elected were Melanie Brown as Vice President, Heather Wagner as Secretary and Judy Foster as Librarian.

A break was held until 8:11 p.m.

- Fire Victim Quilts – Marcia Harlamert reported there were thirty-nine quilts donated that evening to victims of the recent fire in the Mat-Su Valley. This is in addition to the eight previously donated and the seven donated by the Chugach Mountain Quilters. The Red Cross Director in the Mat-Su Valley is giving the quilts personally to the victims. Members can bring quilts through



the Open Sew in October and Marcia will deliver them to the Red Cross Director.

- Grant – Sharon Horwath reported there have been seventeen applications for grants this year.
- Fair Booth – Kim Barr reminded the membership to join the Fair Booth Committee.
- Quilt Camp – Kim Barr reminded the membership to join the Quilt Camp Committee.
- Service Committee – Jill Jackson thanked the members who have participated on the committee in 2019. They are seeking additional members for 2020. They did not have enough quilts to give out in October including quilts to Project Linus. Cheryl Risley told the membership a book with patterns for Project Linus will be in the Library. The next meeting of the committee is at the October Open Sew.
- CASA – Debby Hudson reminded members the deadline to turn in quilts for the CASA auction is November 15th. All sizes of quilts are welcome and appreciated.

Board Meeting Minutes

October 10, 2019

Opening

The Board Meeting of the Valley Quilters Guild was called to order at 6:30 p.m. on October 10, 2019 at the Mat-Su Borough Animal Shelter by Guild President, Marcia Harlamert. Attendees: Marcia Harlamert – President, Linda Brace – Vice President, Elaine Fergen – Parliamentarian, Michelle Buehner – Treasurer, Cheryl Risley – Librarian, and Heather Wagner – Secretary.

Approval of Minutes

The minutes from the September 12, 2019 Board Meeting were reviewed. Elaine Fergen submitted a change to the minutes correcting the new members letter to pending approval and not approved. The minutes were approved as corrected.

Treasurer’s Report

Michelle Buehner reviewed the current financial reports. The Guild has collected \$2000 more than anticipated in the budget by this time of year. Discussion was held regarding the Treasurer’s report.

Committee Reports

Education – Marcia Harlamert presented the Education Committee report sent to her by Jeannie Snodgrass. The Education Committee requested a change to the Standing Policies on refunds for individu-

als who do not participate in scheduled events and classes. Michelle Buehner moved, and Linda Brace seconded updated language in the Standing Policies.

Fees charged to attend an event of the Guild. – Members may find a replacement. If there is a list the replacement must be found from the list. Hardship requests for refunds must be submitted to the Board.

Unfinished Business

Standing Policy Changes – Elaine Fergen presented the Standing Policy Changes.

Approved as submitted with no changes:

- *Established a Cover as page 1 displaying the amendment date.*
- *Moved “Committees-General” to first place under “Committees” in Table of Contents and under the Category “Committees,” because this applies to all committees.*
- *Updated page numbers in the Table of Contents. Added Table of Contents Page 2 to Table of Contents.*
- *Indented all committees under the title “Committees”; all sub-*

categories under the title “Drawings/Raffles; and Sub-categories under the Title “Finances” in the Table of Contents.

- *Under “Appointed Positions” removed PG-3 – Greeter will be appointed.*
- *Added to Established a new Category – Calendaring, and added PG-1 – The Board will establish a yearly Master Calendar for internal planning...*
- *Added Under “Donations” – The Guild will conduct an annual School Supply Drive in August and a Special Santa toy drive in December.*
- *Added under “Drawings – Monthly Drawings – Must be a member to participate.*
- *Added under “Equipment/Keys/Table Rentals” The AccuQuilt Go! Will be placed on the Tech Advisor’s inventory. The Tech Advisor will be responsible for replacement parts, new dies, etc.*
- *Added under “ Equipment/Keys/Table Rentals” – A program presenter at a VQG membership meeting may bring merchandise...*
- *Under “Meetings” – “An opt out sign, stating there is form for those who would not want their picture...At each Membership Meeting a signup sheet for*

announcements not already on the agenda will be set out...Committee sign-up sheets will remain out and in the same place at every meeting.

- *Under Social Media – VQG Members Only Facebook page, in pinned post section.*

Approved with changes:

- *Under “Donations” Memorial Donations – A memorial donation fund will be established with the payments made by members in place of dues (by those who are no longer required to pay dues.) When a member passes away, a \$50 condolence donation will be , made to a charity of the family’s choice, if there is enough money in the memorial donation fund. If there is not enough in the fund, a quilt will be donated to a non-profit in the memory of the member, using first name and last initial.*
- *Under “Finances-General” – The Administrative budget will cover all merchant fees.*
- *Under Library “There will be a binder in the library that contains the current Bylaws...*

New Business

Quilts of Valor – Quilts of Valor has requested to use the raffle drum for their event. Elaine Fergen moved, and Cheryl Risley seconded Quilts of Valor be allowed to use the raffle drum as long as it is returned prior to CASA's event. The motion was approved.

Webmaster and Tech Advisor – Discussion was held regarding website updates and the need to have a Webmaster and Tech Advisor. Michelle Buehner moved, and Cheryl Risley seconded to hire a consultant for \$150 to train a Webmaster. The motion was approved.

Suggestions – A suggestion was submitted to consider magnets for name tags as an option instead of pins. Michelle Buehner will ask the vendor about the option when she picks up the name tags.

A suggestion was submitted to hold a new member orientation. The Board discussed holding an orientation quarterly at Open Sew.

A suggestion was submitted to have a fair for members who do crafts in addition to quilting. The suggestion was to have this in December before the meeting. The Board decided to have this as a special event in November 2020. Members who wish to

participate will have ½ of a table at no cost.

Russ and Glenda Ingram have offered to set-up a table with their hot chocolate at the December meeting. The Board agreed as long as the table is set-up to be safe and accessible.

Adjournment

Elaine Fergen moved to adjourn the meeting and Heather Wagner seconded the motion.

Meeting was adjourned at 9:07 p.m. The next Board Meeting will be held at 6:30 p.m. on November 14, 2019, at the Mat-Su Borough Animal Shelter.



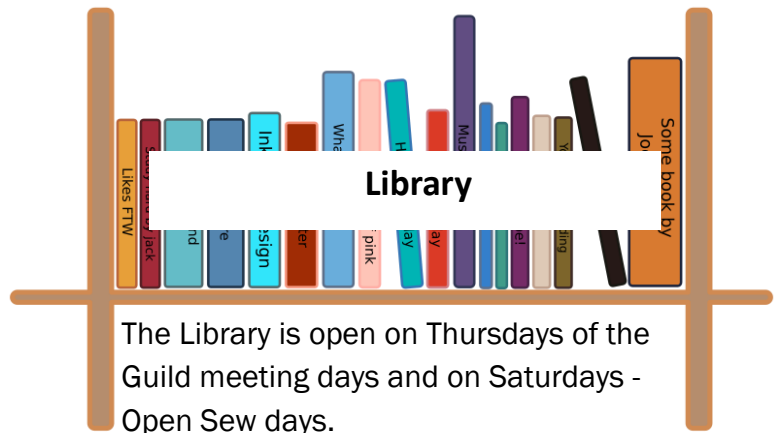
