Marcia Harlamert explained that a lot of our members also belong to the QOV Foundation whose mission is to "cover service members and veterans touched by war with comforting and healing Quilts of Valor".

Linda Kau thanked Marcia and all the Guild members. She went on to tell the story of how the Quilts of Valor Foundation began. Since 2003, over 200,000 have been awarded nationwide; and over 1,200 veterans in Alaska have been recognized. Two were awarded tonight: Amber Brevard, a U.S. Army Veteran, and Mark Ling, U.S.

Air Force Master Sergeant.

Board Meeting Minutes August 2, 2018

Meeting was called to order by President Marcia Harlamert at 6:30 pm. Others in attendance were: Vice President Linda Brace, Treasurer Pat Kilmain, Secretary Kim Medlock, Parliamentarian Linda Pendergrass, Historian Jill Jackson, Elaine Fergen, Marcia Healy, and Patty Livingston.

A. There were no corrections/additions to the August minutes; they stand approved as read.

B. Treasurer's Report

C. Committee Reports

1. Camp: Linda Brace is having lunch with Jackie Warren and Kim Barr. She will talk to them about handing this Committee over to them so she will no longer be the Chairperson. She will remain a member of the Committee.

2. Fair: Marcia Healy

- a. Total sales were \$11,665.56, and 70% was by credit card.
- b. We made another sale this week.
- c. They are trying to figure out things to do to "shore up" the booth. They have purchased beams which will be attached to the bottom to keep it off the ground during winter storage. The ramp will have to be modified next year. The cost of the beams put them

over budget by about \$100.

3. **Grant:** Meg Hills sent an email report to the Board:

They hope to have a Committee meeting in early October to determine who will be awarded the Grant money. So far, as of today, we have two (2) applicants. Sharon Horwath and Meg will be meeting early next week to develop the strategies for looking over all applicants for the Grant. Thanks to Elaine and Kim, we will have some updated info and applications on the new website. Kim is also looking into how we might make the application process 'on line' in addition to being snail mailed to us. Any other ideas or suggestions will be gratefully accepted..... especially for next years 'process'!

- 4. **Raffle:** Elaine Fergen reported that they are almost ready to start assembly of the 2019 Raffle Quilt. Someone has donated a quilt kit for 2020; it is the Alaska Shop Hop from 2010.
- 5. **Retreat:** Pat Kilmain reported that 32 have signed up so far, eight spots remaining.
- 6. Service: Patty Livingston reported

that she and Charlotte Honner would like to step down as Co-Chairs; they will stay on until the end of the year. Patty is willing to keep the storage unit

going which means keeping it organized.

D. Unfinished Business

1. **Square:** we used the Square on a trial basis for the Fair Booth this year. Kim Medlock presented costs for the data plan (s) needed to continue using it throughout the year at meetings/events. Pat Kilmain reported that we can get a brand new iPad mini for \$529.

Pat is willing to donate the new style of Square which is Bluetooth since the new devices don't have headphone jacks.

- * Linda Pendergrass made a motion that we go ahead with the AT&T Prepaid Plan of \$25 per month for 2GB of data and purchase the iPad mini so we can continue to accept credit card purchases. Jill Jackson seconded; motion failed.
- * Linda Brace made a motion that we continue with the Square to collect funds throughout the year at any Guild event. Linda Pedergrass seconded; motion

passed.

- * Linda Brace made a motion that we set up service with AT&T for their \$25 Prepaid Plan of 2GB of data for the remainder of 2018 using the Technology Budget, and going forward for 2019 out of the Administrative Budget. Linda Pendergrass seconded; motion passed.
- 2. **Website:** Kim Medlock will talk to Sarah Lorimer about when we can expect a launch date.
- 3. **Programs for 2019:** Pat Kilmain made a motion that we table the topic of "Programs for 2019" until the October Board Meeting. Linda Pendergrass seconded; motion passed.

4. Candidates for Upcoming Election:

- a. Linda Pendergrass reported that we have candidates for three out of the four offices so far:
 - · Treasurer Karen Tomczak
 - · Historian Sarah Lorimer
 - · Parliamentarian Elaine Fergen

b. Linda joined an online forum for Robert's Rules in order to ask questions about our upcoming election since we don't have any-

one willing to run for the office of President at this time.



c. Jill Jackson and Pat Kilmain will count ballots at the October Meeting.

E. New Business

1. Proposed 2019 Budget:

- a. Marcia Harlamert proposed that we add a line to the Income as "Transfer from Savings" in the amount of \$1,682 to cover the deficit in our 2019 budget.
- b. Linda Pendergrass made a motion that we approve the Budget as amended. Linda Brace seconded; motion passed.

2. Other:

a. Depot dates: there are proposed increases for the rental rates for 2019, but if we pay our rental now, we are grandfathered in at the current rates. The Borough is also proposing to use "real-time" scheduling for the Depot in the future which means we may end up without our dates. There was discussion about writing letters expressing our concern, and then attending the meeting to give

public testimony. Marcia will write down points to address in a letter and send it out to the Board plus Patty Livingston, Marcia Healy, and Elaine Fergen. Linda Brace will finalize the letter.

- d. Block-of-the-Month: Kim Medlock reported that participation in this program has dwindled by half since 2016. Maybe this program has run its course or there need to be much simpler blocks in the future. There was discussion about going back to quilting basics at Open Sew.
- e. Date changes: the Crayon Challenge deadline was changed from October to November at the September Membership Meeting. This is in conflict with the UFO Auction scheduled for the November Meeting. Linda Pendergrass made a mo-

tion that we move the deadline for finished Crayon Challenge projects to January 2019. Jill Jackson seconded; motion passed.

f. Classes on Open Sew day: Open Sew should take precedence over a half-day class. The Crazy Quilting class which was announced for Saturday, November 10, with a local teacher(s) must be moved to the church as per policy.

F. Mail / Announcements: tabled until next month.




